We are excited to announce that the next Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting will be held virtually on **December 13, 2021, from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM**. The purpose of this CAC meeting is to review the Alternatives Workbook and to hear from you about the range of potential land use and circulation options for the next 20-30 years. ## **Community Event Set #2 Summary and Requests**

We are now launching into the second round of community engagement, which is focused on discussing and evaluating land use and circulation alternatives. Virtual Workshop and Survey The Project Team is developing a Virtual Workshop space that is envisioned to become a one-stop destination for Santa Rosans interested in the project. The space will include similar materials as those at the in-person workshops, plus additional written direction and videos enabling visitors to provide input without assistance from the Project Team or CAC Members. The Virtual Workshop space will include multiple opportunities and pause points for people to engage with alternatives materials and each other.
