

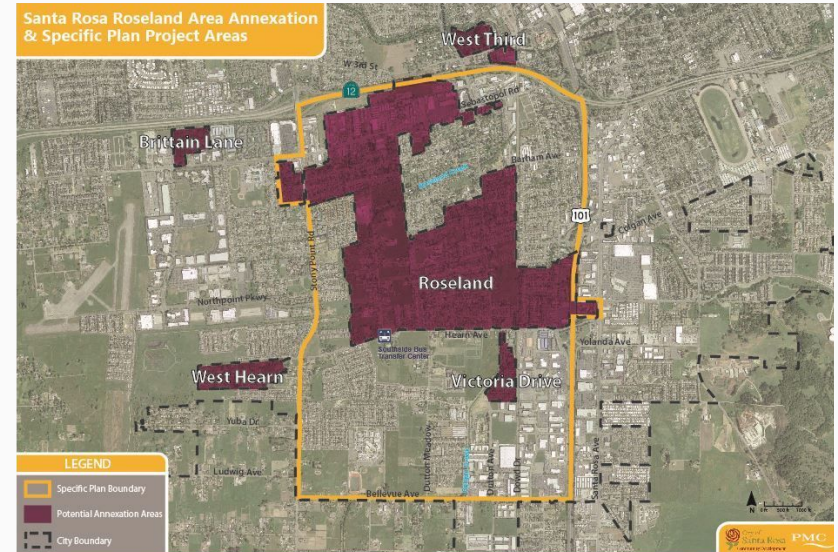

- Increase lighting in low lit areas

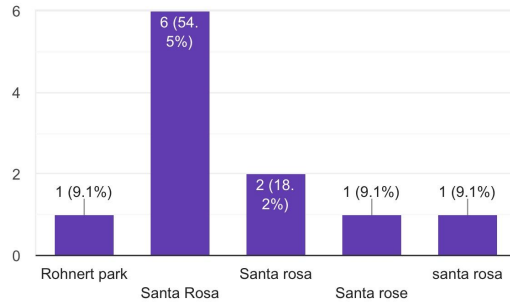

Where do you live?



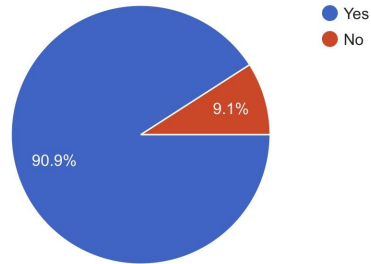

Do you feel safe in your community ?



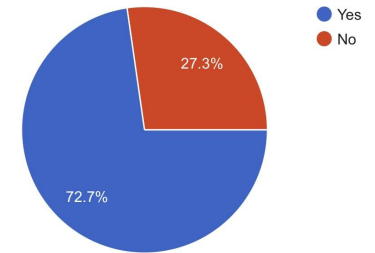
